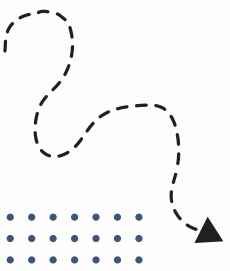
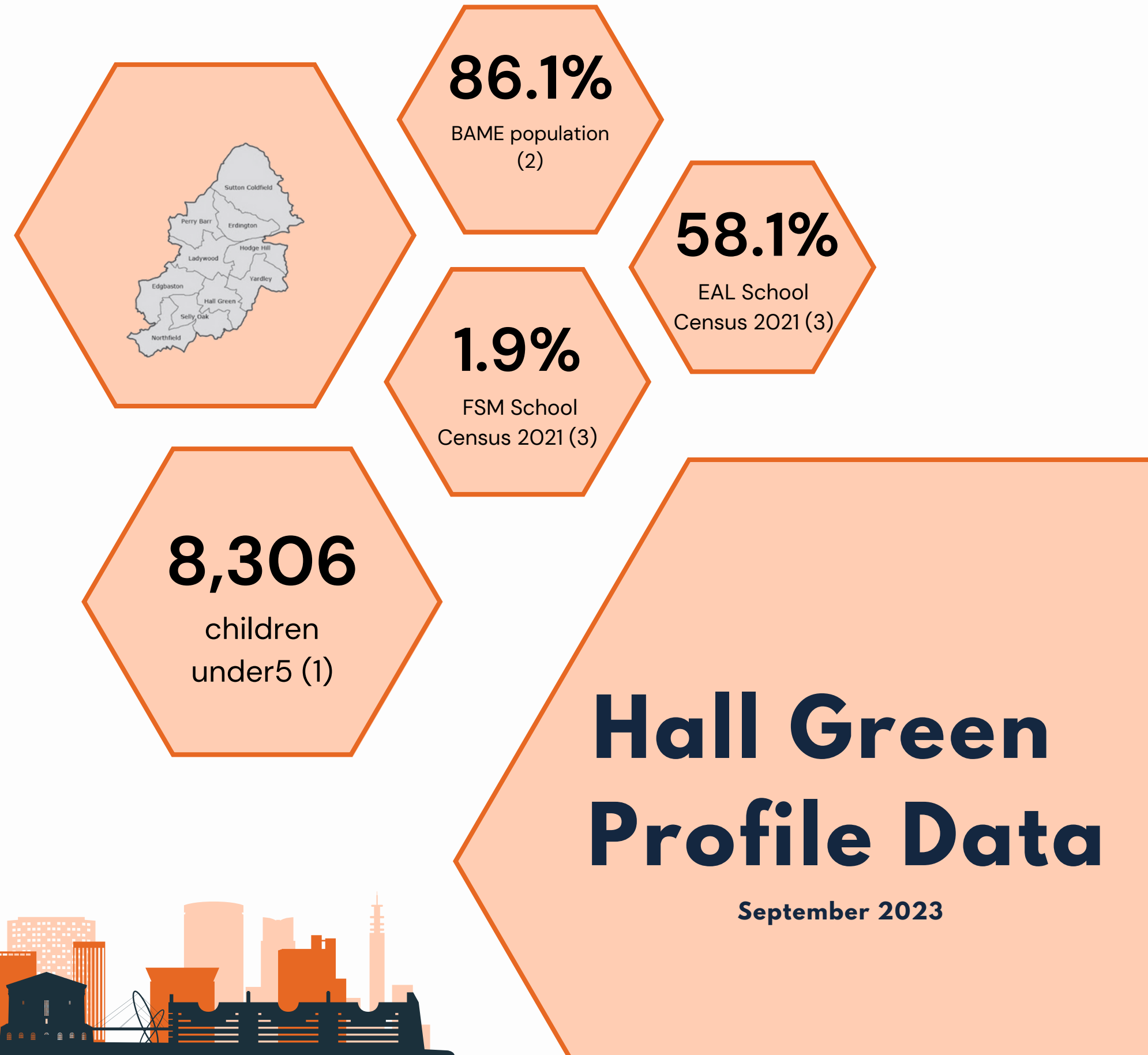

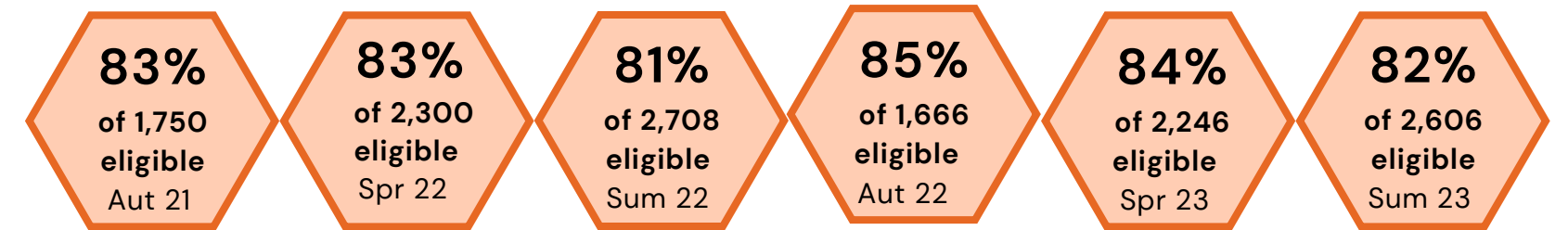
30.7% children in the Central Locality aged 0–15 live in absolute poverty compared to 27.6% across the city (3)

14.9% children aged 4–5 in the Sparkbrook and Balsall Heath East ward were classed as obese compared to 11% across the city (3)



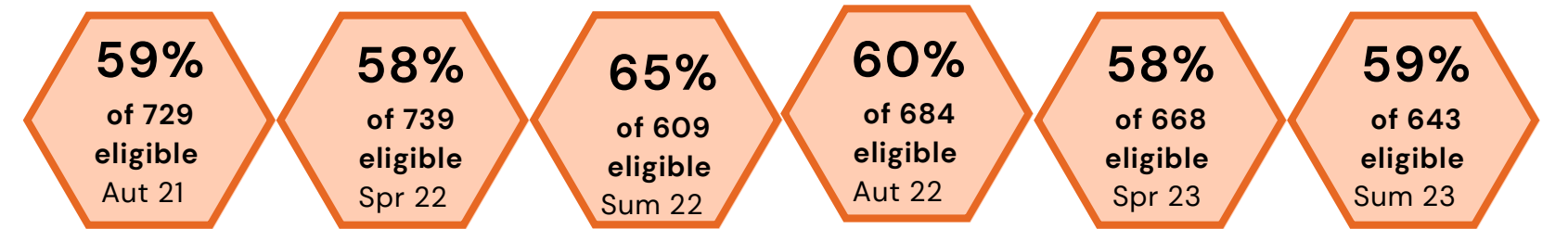

## 3 year Early Education Entitlement Uptake – 3EEE (5)

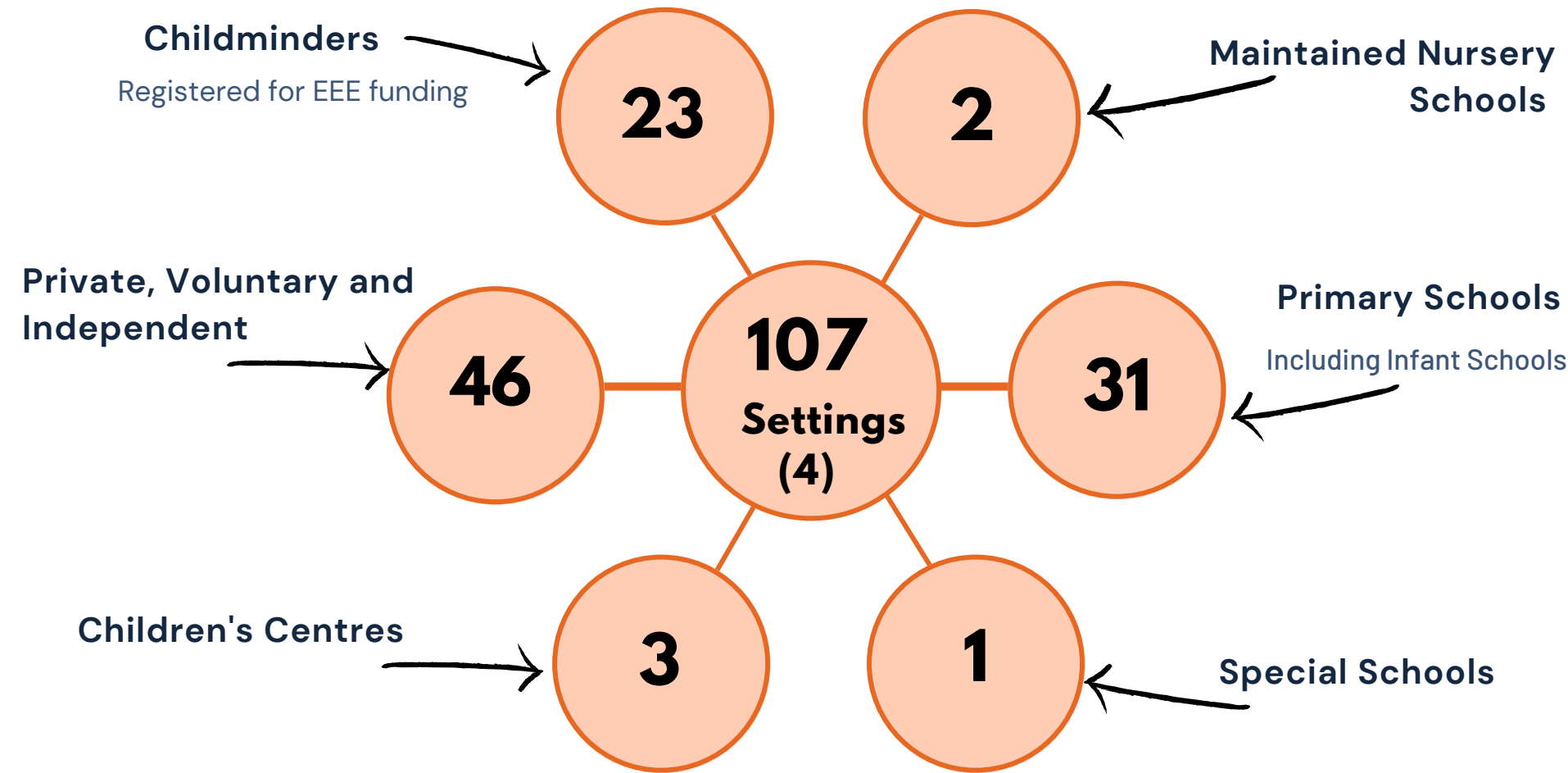


3EEE uptake: England 92% (DfE 2022)

## 2 year Early Education Entitlement Uptake – 2EEE (5)



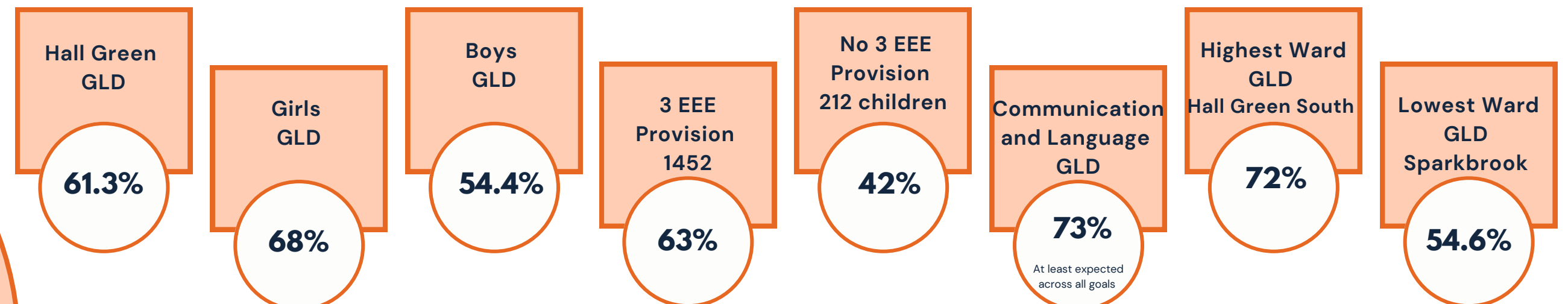
2EEE uptake: England 72% (DfE 2022)

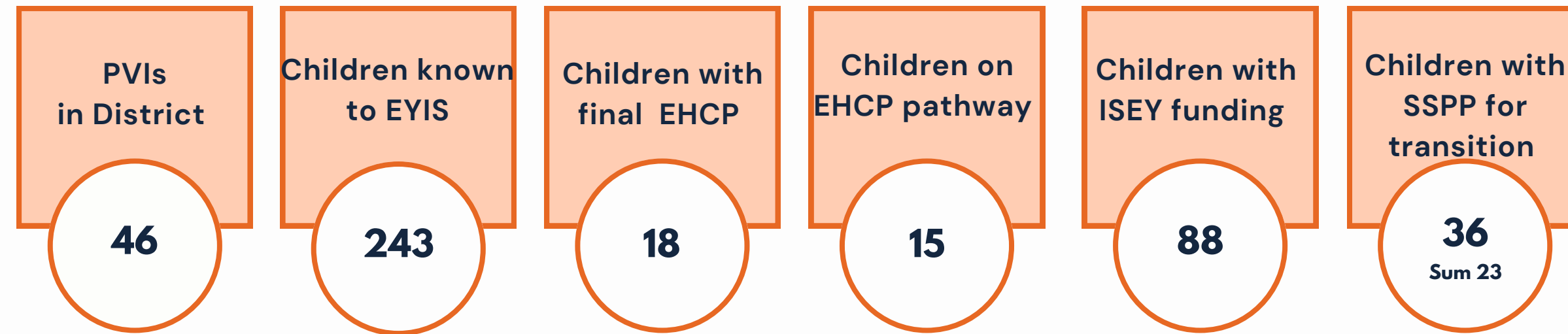

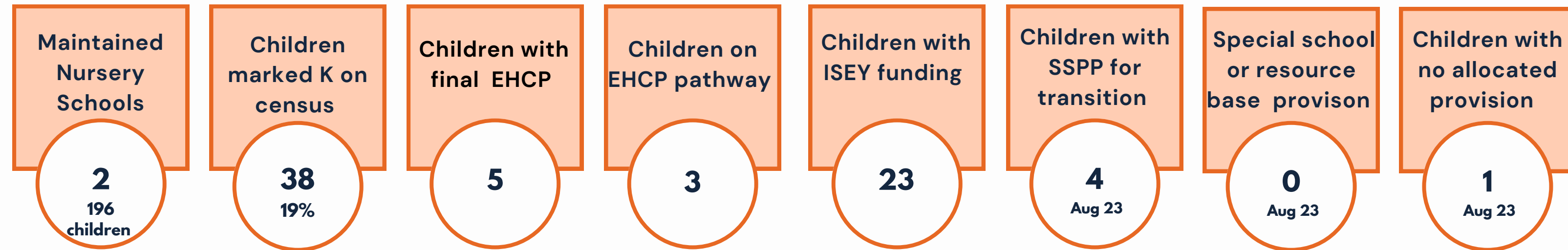

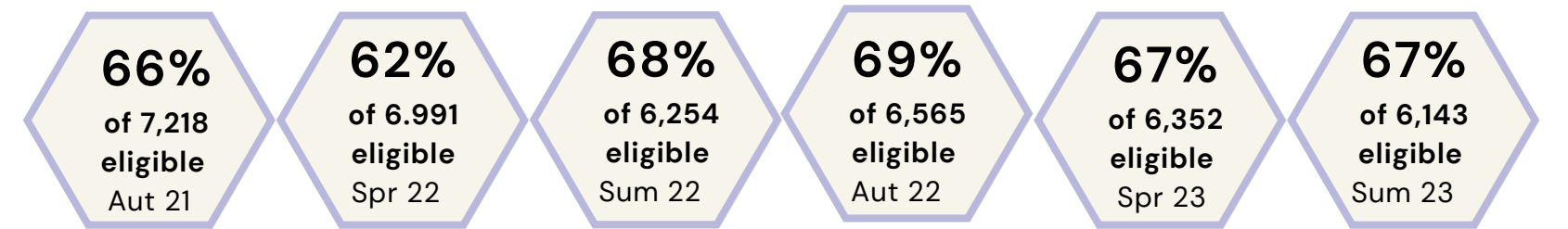


## 3 year Early Education Entitlement Uptake – 3EEE (5)



3EEE uptake: England 92% (DfE 2022)

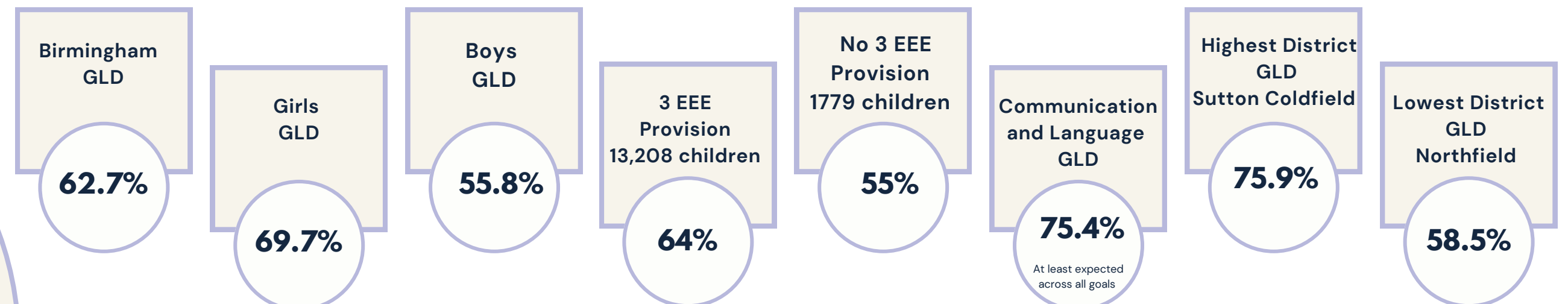

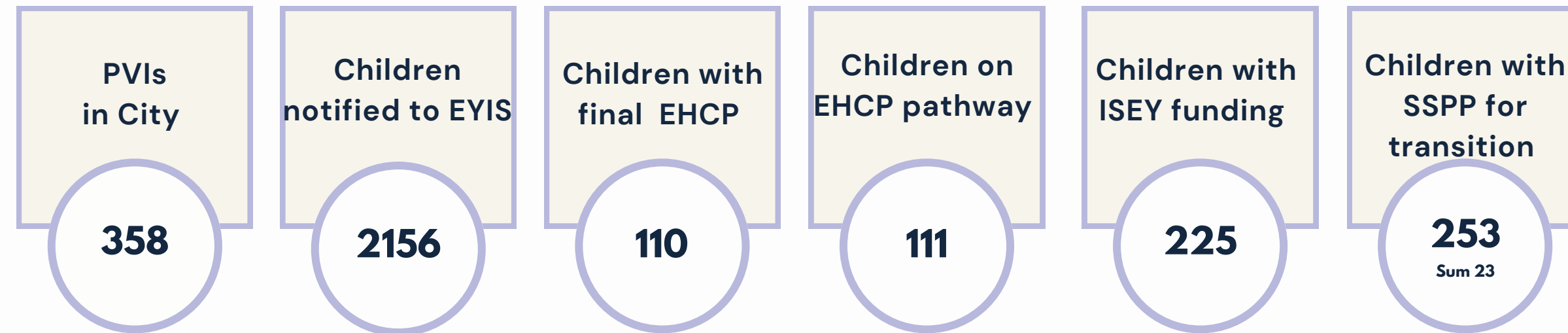

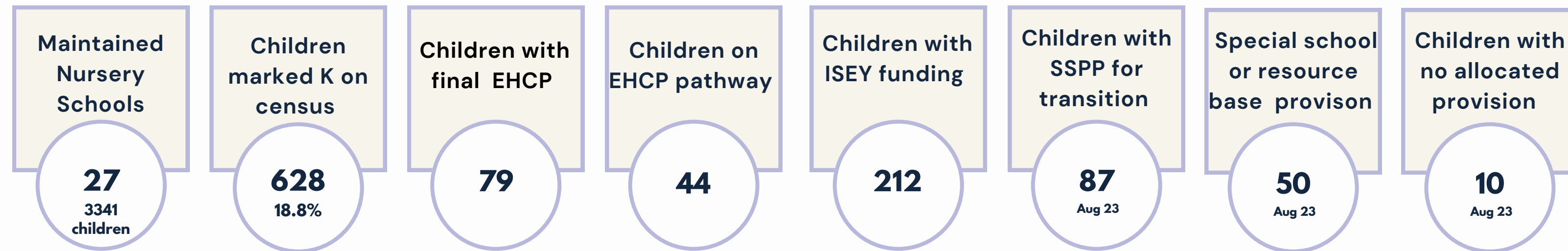
