



#### Did you know?

The most deprived ward (8/69) is Shard End. The least deprived ward (38/69) is Bromford and Hodge Hill (3) 38.8% children in the East Locality aged O-15 live in absolute poverty compared to 27.6% across the city (3) 15.2% children aged 4-5 in the Small Heath ward were classed as obese compared to 11% across the city (3)











#### Hodge Hill District Early Education Entitlement (EEE) Data
